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Students' perception on "Student Democracy" concept

The purpose of this study was to find out the opinion of the students regarding the concept of "Student Democracy", what they think that this concept involves, and which is their position with respect to what the concept represents.

The study was made using a questionnaire containing 56 questions and it was applied by the representatives of Babeş-Bolyai University, Cluj-Napoca, Romania and University of South-Eastern, Norway.

The questionnaire is structured as follows:

- Demographic of data
- The concept of "Student Democracy" Representation vs Involvement
- "Student Democracy" Student associations
- "Student Democracy" CoViD 19

The questionnaire was applied in Romania and in Norway and it was completed by 148 students (102 from Romania and 46 from Norway). This sample contains student from bachelor and master level, from first, second or third year (bachelor level) and first and second year (master level). The specializations of the respondents cover a wide range, from social sciences to technical sciences, from medicine to philosophy.

Some questions were skipped from this report due to a very low number of answers (see for example Q32-Q44 regarding the students who are representatives).










Regarding the age of the respondents, most of them are between 19 and 22 years old. The average of the 147 respondents is 22.31 years old.






Only 7% from the respondents have participate to the project in discussion.

It is interesting to see that 37.5% from the respondents (most of them) identify politics with "the clash of interest" and for 6.25%, politics means "action, noise and










fury". We can conclude that this vision of the students about politics comes from the very low standards of romanian politicians.








Regarding the concept of "student democracy", 45.14% of the respondents, say that they are somehow familiar with the concept and those who are or aren't familiar are equally distributed.








Decisions regarding the educational process should be made for students with the active participation of the students. This is important for more than 60% of the respondents.







Trust is important for almost 75% of the respondents. They agree that the trust in the others is very important. In this way they can fight for their rights.












Regarding the trust they we should have in our leaders, 65% of the respondents consider that it is important. Still, they are with 10% less compared with those who consider that we should trust each other.


According to the results obtained to this question, students didn't encountered very often problems related to courses, seminars, or evaluation. 19.72% reported frequent problems related to courses, 11.89% related to seminars and 19.02% related to evaluation.

What is interesting to point out here is the fact that each semester the romanian students have the possibility to evaluate the courses, seminars, and the method of evaluation, but just a few of them fill the questionnaire.












14.90% of the respondents encountered frequently problems related with unethical behaviour, 5.60% related to gender discrimination and only 2.86% related to racism.

It is a clear thing that any problem related to academic life or personal life in the faculty should be reported. According to the respondents, over 80% consider that such problems must be personally reported.












The representatives play an important role in all faculties, so if you cannot report a problem personally, let your representatives do it for you. Over 80% of the respondents agree with this idea.























Just 16.15% are member of such an association which shows, in fact, that, in general students want to be represented not to be directly involved.

Q49. The association I belong to, plays an important role in understanding my rights and obligations as a student








Same as before, being active in a student association it is a good experience and creates the premises to understand and develop student democracy.



The CoViD-19 pandemic changed everything including the life and activity of the students. We were interested to find out if this period affected some of the components of student democracy.



Conclusions

The conclusions of this study can be summarized as follows:

In general students are not aware about their rights but also, they do not know their obligations, they oscillate between direct involvement and representativeness. When it comes to direct involvement, even if they have identified some problems, just a few reported them and if they know about the local student association, they are not a part of it.

As a final conclusion, a course about Student democracy, or simply Democracy, should be a good idea for all students no matter what specialization are they following. In this way they will become responsible citizens.




